Pastor's Column

Summer is a time when, hopefully, we can take a little break from our usual routines, take a deep breath and find some refreshment and renewal. Recently, a friend, Dr. Gray Norris, from Charlotte, North Carolina, sent me a devotional written by a member of his Church, Myers Park Presbyterian Church. This message, based on Ecclesiastes 8:14 – 9:10, speaks to our need to enjoy God's good creation:

Key verses in Scripture: 9:7-10: "Go, eat your bread with enjoyment, and drink your wine with a merry heart; for God has long ago approved what you do. Let your garments always be white; do not let oil be lacking on your head. Enjoy life with the wife whom you love, all the days of your vain life that are given you under the sun, because that is your portion in life and in your toil at which you toil under the sun. Whatever your hand finds to do, do with your might; for there is no work or thought or knowledge or wisdom in Sheol, to which you are going."

Reflection: "So often we think of Scripture as a legal book of 'shalls' and 'shall nots' and we think of faithfulness as busy obedience to all of God's commands. We may hear the gospel of grace but we have a hard time letting that grace into our hearts. We know that we don't have to earn God's love for us but we still spend a lot of energy trying to prove ourselves. How refreshing to read these verses from the book of Ecclesiastes! Did you even realize that this message is in the Bible? This is a reminder that life is short and calls for proper perspective. Ecclesiastes warns us that most of our effort has little eternal significance. While we live on this earth, God actually wants us to enjoy ourselves. God, creator of the universe, wants our lives to be joyful. Relish a good meal, enjoy time with your family, wear clothes that lift your spirits.

We have a magnet at home that reads 'Yesterday is history, tomorrow is mystery, today is a gift.' God wants us to live life to the fullest. Enjoy a glass of cold lemonade on a hot summer afternoon. Listen to the laughter of children playing at the pool. Bite into a tomato sandwich or savor some homemade ice cream. In all of it, give thanks to God for the goodness of creation. Give thanks for the senses of sight, sound, taste, touch and smell. Find a bit of joy in your day and let that joy into your heart."

Prayer: "Loving God, we thank you for the beauty of creation. We thank you for the gifts of sight, sound, taste, touch, and smell. Heighten our awareness of the goodness around us. Attune our spirits to your grace and fill our hearts with joy.

Through Jesus Christ we pray. Amen."

Who Is Jesus Christ To Me?

As part of their training to be Deacons and Elders of the Newnan Presbyterian Church, your new Officers were asked to respond to the question: "Who Is Jesus Christ to Me?" Here is a response from one of our Officers:

My first thought is WHAT A QUESTION and how do I answer it? He is the Son of God who was sent to forgive us of all our sins. To me, he is this "mysterious," Godly figure to whom we pray. It seems I pray a lot when I am troubled and when my family is troubled. I'm sure he says to the Lord, "Father it's that Sister again, wonder what she wants this time?"

I have always gone to Church. First it was a little Baptist Church in Tennessee. It was the social thing to go to Church on Wednesday night, Sunday school and church on Sunday night. I was baptized in the local swimming hole. Mother got me a white dress. We went to Church again that night. I remember it as being a very happy day. My parents were always involved in Church. Mother taught Sunday school and my Daddy was the choir leader and sang in a quartet. When I went to Knoxville, I still went to Church, but it was really a social thing. We went to Church to be seen and to see all.

Until I met Bob, and we had Jeff, I was not that involved. We went to a small church when we were in Jackson, MS and then later when Jeff was about three, Bob was transferred to Philadelphia. We lived in a small New Jersey town across the River from Philadelphia. Bob and I decided to find us a church and get involved. We visited a few churches and found a nice Presbyterian Church and became members and were active in all aspects of worship. Bob was again transferred to be the New York District Director, and we later moved to the Princeton, NJ area. We did belong to a church, but we were not involved in the activities of the Church.

However, during all the above, I still knew Jesus. I'm not sure how much of a Christian I was, but my faith was there. Actually, my life had gone so good up to that point, that I'm not sure I prayed as often as I should have.

A few years later we moved to Atlanta. We didn't look for a house anywhere but Newnan. Our first visitors at our home, with 100 plus boxes sitting around, were Lee Sport and Dick Swayze.

We started coming to NPC. Jeff, our son, joined NPC before Bob and I did. You talk about emotional. That was one of the most moving times that I can ever remember and still am emotional when I think about that morning. There was so much love in my heart that it was literally bursting. Shortly after, Bob and I joined and have been very active.

To me, this question is very personal and very private. Hence, it is so hard to put into words my feelings. I have always admired all the previous Elders and Deacons who have so reverently put into words their feelings.

Jesus is there for us all. I feel his presence when I enter Newnan Presbyterian Church and always feel peaceful. Bob and I have a favorite pew. Sometimes when I pick up the blue hymnal and it is the hymnal given by Shirley Dudley in memory of my mother, my heart is so full with the spirit. I always thank Jesus for giving me that moment. I know that he lives forever in our hearts.

DC's Personal Reflection

Being new to the Southeast, there are certain places that are quite frequently touted as being "not to miss." One of those places is Montreat, NC. When we first booked the home in Montreat, I was a bit skeptical on how connected campers from other churches would be to our youth. I worried about what I would do since the youth were in small groups for 5 hours out of the day and what my wife and children would do with all of that time in the mountains. God answered my worries with sore legs, hurting feet, and an overwhelming flood of the Spirit surrounding me. I have said it several times since coming home, "Everything is uphill at Montreat!" and that is true. However, nothing can compare to the wonderful spirit that seems to cover those mountains. I can say without any hesitation or reservation that Montreat is a "place that should not be missed."



What Happened at Montreat?

The theme for Montreat this year was "In These Waters." The water theme was an amazing springboard for discussion into the major areas of life every teenager struggles with and endures. The first day was an introduction to the theme and to the small groups. They played "getting to know you" games and "trust building" games to prepare them for what was lying ahead. The second day took on the "rough waters" theme. The keynote speaker and worship leaders focused on the challenges that youth face on a day-to-day basis and the major challenges the youth face in life. The most memorable quote for the entire week was made during the second Keynote address. When speaking of being baptized, Rev. Gail Nelson shared what her pastor told her as she stepped into the river. "Gail, if your faith is shallow, then the water will be deep. But if your faith is deep, then the water will be shallow." This profound statement set the tone for the rest of the conference for our youth and for the entire week. Wednesday (Day 3) was filled with images on what to do during storms and how the believer is not alone in the storm. Thursday concentrated on the verse from Amos that states: "Let justice roll down like waters, and righteousness like an ever-flowing stream." The students explored how we can make a positive impact on the world around us by looking to the needs of others. The final day was being "un-bottled water" within our home communities. The worship leaders asked the question, "How will you act in your home lake?"

All in all, the week was a wonderful exploration of how God surrounds us like water, quenches us with water, and sometimes douses us with water to wake us. Catch one of the youth who went to Montreat this year to inquire about their experience. I am sure their answer will be "amazing!"
