Pastor's Column

Answering "Who am I?," is a question we will not ever fully answer. Answering that question is an ongoing process that never ends. However, Lent is a period for us to examine our lives – where we have been, where we are now and where we want to go in the coming days.

The Lenten Season began with Ash Wednesday on February 17th. In his book, **Whistling In The Dark: A Doubter's Dictionary**, Frederick Buechner gives the following definition of Lent:

"In many cultures, there is an ancient custom of giving a tenth of each year's income to some holy use. For Christians, to observe the forty days of Lent is to do the same thing with roughly a tenth of each year's days. After being baptized by John in the River Jordan, Jesus went off alone in the wilderness where he spent forty days asking himself the question of what it means to be Jesus. During Lent, Christians are supposed to ask, one way or another, what it means to be themselves....."

If you had to bet everything you have on whether there is a God or whether there isn't, which side would get your money and why?

When you look at your face in the mirror, what do you see in it that you most like and what do you see in it that you most deplore.

If you had only one last message to leave to the handful of people who are most important to you, what would it be in twenty-five words or less?

Of all the things you have done in your life, which is the one you would most like to undo? Which is the one that makes you the happiest to remember?

Is there any person in the world, or any cause, that if circumstances called for it, you would be willing to die for?

If this were the last day of your life, what would you do with it?

To hear yourself try to answer questions like these is to begin to hear something not only of who you are, but both what you are becoming and what you are failing to become."

We have begun Lent on Ash Wednesday, in sackcloth and ashes, but we are brave enough to do that only in light of Easter. Our Lord Jesus said: **"Behold, I make all things new!"**

In Buechner's words: **"(Lent) can be a pretty depressing business all in all, but if sackcloth and ashes are at the start of it, something like Easter may be at the end!"**

HISTORY NPC PRESBYTERIAN WOMEN (formed 1851)

1927-1930 (note: 1929 to 1940, The Great Depression)

Mrs. Powell, Mrs. Parrott, & Mrs. Turner moved to furnish the
guest room at the manse and enclose this plan by a promise from
the Auxiliary to furnish by voluntary subscriptions whatever was
needed after the fund is exhausted. The President reported that
the cost of beautifying the church grounds: \$121 was paid to Mr.
Kehely. An electric stove donated by Mrs. Powell was installed in
the church kitchen. A special program for the season of prayer
and self-denial was for Foreign missions. The Centennial of our
church was held, June 21st-24th, 1928 and the Auxiliary served a
luncheon in the church basement; about 200 were present. In Oct
1928, a group conference met in Newnan with about 60 ladies
present. "Even with the financial depression, the budget shows a
5% increase and our 3 special offerings have been larger than
ever before. There has been a splendid spirit of cooperation and
interest and spiritual growth and we feel that God has prospered
the work this year."

Presbytery Highlights

February 20, 2010 Meeting Highlights

These are highlights of the February 20, 2010 Meeting of the Presbytery of Greater Atlanta. Mr. John Birmingham and Mr. Dabo Davis were our Commissioners at this Presbytery Meeting.

The new Moderator, Dudley Rose, and the new Executive Presbyter, Tom Evans, were both installed. Mark Roberson preached a thoughtful sermon for the Presbytery tying together the themes from last year.

The Korean Presbyterian Church of Lawrenceville, Good News Garden and Jesus Hope churches will be dismissed to a new non-geographic Korean Presbytery if the General Assembly creates it.

Sylvia Wilson spoke to the Presbytery about the important and unique piece that Johnson C. Smith Seminary adds to the Presbyterian story.

The Coordinating Council has engaged Holy Cow consulting group to work with the Presbytery in developing its Strategic Mission Plan.

The Task Force on Donor-Directed Giving reported its final recommendations to the Presbytery: that the Presbytery create a Funds Development Team through the Coordinating Council; that this team create procedures for accepting proposals; and that the team create guidelines for assessing those proposals.

The 2010 Budget was approved.

Ben Blake from Presbyterian Investment & Loan Program presented three rebate checks totaling over \$9,000 to churches who have been investing.

Several young people who will be attending the Youth Triennium were commissioned.

Due to the bequest of Pilgrimage Church, every church in the Presbytery is eligible to receive a defibrillator. Contact Brenda Gales at 770-861-4767.

An overture from the Peacemaking Committee on the war in Afghanistan was approved to be sent to the General Assembly.

Six new ministers were received: Karen Allamon (Rock Spring Church), Jamie Butcher (validated ministry), Robin Humphreys (validated ministry); Nae Yong Lee (NCD), Alex Moses (Fayette) and Jason Whitener (St. Luke's).

Five inquirers moved to candidacy: Sarah Bogue, Andrew Ditzel, Sharon Junn, Neill McKay and Billy Honor.

Three retirements were celebrated: Joanna Adams, Gail Perkins and Dudley Rose.

The next Stated Meeting of Presbytery will be May 11, 2010 at Good Shepherd Church.

In Lent:

Forgiveness is often a hard subject for adults to handle, but throw in the changing bodies and expanding minds of teenagers and forgiveness becomes a class 5 rapid of the heart. Each Sunday night in March, the youth will take on the audacious challenge of exploring what God's forgiveness means to them.
