Pastor's Column

This year Shrove Tuesday will be February 16th. That evening, our Deacons will prepare a Shrove Tuesday Pancake Supper. The Season of Lent begins the next day on Ash Wednesday. We will have a worship service, involving the imposition of ashes, at 6:30 p.m. Wednesday. At this service, we will hear and confess: **"Remember that you are dust and to dust you shall return."** And, so, we will begin Lent with a confession of our own mortality – our finiteness... with a confession that we are creatures, not the Creator.

On the first Sunday of Lent, February 21, we will have our Annual Preaching Series with Central Baptist Church. Our guest preacher this year is Dr. Brett Younger. Dr. Younger is the Associate Professor of preaching at the McAfee School of Theology at Mercer University in Atlanta. Before coming to Atlanta, Dr. Younger served as a pastor for twenty-two years in Texas, Kansas and Indiana. He has authored a book, *Who Moved My Pulpit?*, along with numerous articles. In addition, in his own words, he "is a poor tennis player!" Dr. Younger and his wife, Carol, have two sons, Graham, a junior at Davidson College and Caleb, a sophomore at Parkview High School. He will preach in three worship services on February 21 – 8:30 a.m., Newnan Presbyterian Church; 11:00 a.m., Central Baptist Church and 6:00 p.m., Newnan Presbyterian Church. The theme for his three sermons is "Praying the Psalms." The Preaching Series with Dr. Younger should be a wonderful way to begin the Lenten Season.

The Season of Lent invites us to life-giving confession. Our theme for the Lenten Season is "Praying Through Lent." Aesop, in one of his fables, states: "Men often applaud imitation and hiss at the real thing." During Lent, we try to look at the story of Jesus Christ, including his life, death and resurrection, as it really was. And, we will be encouraged to pray to God with all our heart, soul, body and mind and pray for our neighbors as for ourselves.

In the words of Joanna Adams... "Each year the church does what it can to counter the simulation of Christianity by observing the season of Lent, a period of forty days reminiscent of the forty years the children of Israel spent in the wilderness after their exodus from Egypt. Lent also commemorates the forty days Jesus spent in the desert between Jericho and the Dead Sea, where he was tempted by the devil. There is nothing more authentic and real that can be said about human existence than that it will inevitably include times of testing. This may be God's world, but there is another player on the field – the power of evil." (Joanna Adams, *Journal for Preachers*, Lent, 2010, p.15).

Of course, at the end of Lent – at Easter – we remember Who won this battle! I invite you to take an active part in the activities of the Lenten Season. I guarantee you it will make your celebration of Easter much more meaningful!

HISTORY NPC PRESBYTERIAN WOMEN (formed 1851)

1920-1926: The women of the Church continue their diligent work. Mrs. Salbide read an urgent appeal for help from the West Point Church. We sent \$5. Mrs. Mott Martin, an African missionary, gave a most interesting account of her work. The Methodist and Baptist societies joined us for this meeting. Treasurers reports show a total of \$216 for all causes. The Self-Denial offering for Foreign Missions amounted to \$56.

The Women's Auxiliary held a most interesting and unusual meeting. Mrs. Mike Powell had charge of the program which represented a meeting of the Ladies Benevolent Society on October 2, 1851, our 75th anniversary. The setting was an old fashioned parlor and the costumes worn were of the fashion of those days.

Who Is Jesus Christ To Me

As part of their training to be Deacons and Elders of the Newnan Presbyterian Church, your new Officers were asked to respond to the question: "Who Is Jesus Christ To Me?" Here is a response from one of our Officers:

Jesus is my Lord and Savior who came to into this world to save me from my sins. While Jesus was on Earth, he used stories and parables to show us how we should live our lives as Christians. Although his time on Earth was short, what he left for humanity has lived for over two thousand years and is as relevant today as it was during the early life of the church.

Through Jesus' parables, he taught us to live in a manner that would make the world a better place. He taught us to be honorable, morally responsible, courageous and religious people; and that the purpose of the church is to serve God and fellow human beings.

I grew up in the Carrollton Presbyterian church where I attended Sunday School, Vacation Bible School, family night suppers, and choir practice (although I cannot sing a note of music) and was baptized and confirmed. I participated in communion, Easter Sunday services, midnight Christmas Eve services and Sunday morning services. All of these and many more activities gave me a feeling of belonging to a community of faith and shaped my life as a Christian. Even today when I walk into the sanctuary of the Carrollton Church, I have a feeling of peace and of belonging to something much larger than myself. As an adult, I have belonged to the Newnan Presbyterian Church for over 30 years. I still attend those same services that I attended as a child, and my children were baptized and confirmed in the Newnan church.

Jesus gives us hope for the future. Chapter 10.5 of the Declaration of Faith puts it this way: "We know that our efforts cannot bring in God's kingdom. But, hope plunges us into the struggle for victories over evil that are possible now in the world, the church and our individual lives."

What makes a person a "Hero of Faith?" Do they have to share the life changing words of Christ with an entire country, a la Mother Teresa, Billy Graham or Saint Patrick? Hebrews 11:6 says, "Without faith it is impossible to please God, for whoever would approach God must believe that God exists and that God rewards those who seek God." We are taking these stories and asking the questions: what does that kind of faith look like in the 21st century and how do we, as a youth group, apply Hebrews 11:6 to our lives? After three weeks, we have come up with a few solutions but we still have 4 weeks left of our study.
